On September 11, 2009, UDSL held its first September 11th memorial in the Dean's lounge in Joseph Keller Hall. Both students and faculty gathered to discuss and reflect on the tragic events that occurred eight years ago and its impact on our lives today. Many of the event's attendees were personally affected by September 11.

Professor Dennis Greene, who moderated the discussion, told the group of his experience. He was living in his hometown of New York City that summer and was working at Seton Hall School of Law in Newark, NJ. He commuted from the World

## H1N1 Flu Update

9/15/09 — The University of Dayton has one confirmed case of H1N1 flu, according to a test report received last night. The student has recovered and returned to class after self-isolating in a house in the student neighborhood while experiencing symptoms. The student was seen at the Health Center last week for influenza-like illness and was tested for the H1N1 virus.

A number of students reportedly have been seen by local physicians and told they may have the H1N1 virus. We encourage students to report their medical conditions to Edell Jesse, director of communications and community relations in the student development division, to help University administrators put in place additional care systems

Students who have not been seen by a physician and think they have influenza should be evaluated by a physician before reporting. Only students that have been told they have either influenza or influenza-like illness (not stomach flu, viral upper respiratory infection, pharyngitis, sinusitis, gastroenteritis or other infections not caused by influenza viruses) or given Tamiflu or Relenza should report. Students should call and provide their name and general address (e.g., seventh floor Marycrest) to help track any trends and allow area coordinators and resident assistants to assist floors and houses.

Other attendees shared their stories and reflected on how 9/11 and its aftermath impacted their lives. Nan Holler-Potter, a Sr. Administrative Secretary at the school, told her story of how she and her family were affected by the events that unfolded. Her 24 year old nephew, Nick Brown, was part of the armed forces deployed to Iraq in 2007. A mere 8 days after his son was born, Nick was in

Mosul, Iraq driving an army vehicle. He saw an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) out of the corner of his eye and swerved in an attempt to avoid it. His maneuver saved his comrades but unfortunately, Nick did not survive the ordeal himself.

Upon hearing this story, the discussion group expressed their gratitude, not only to that

## MISCELLANEOUS

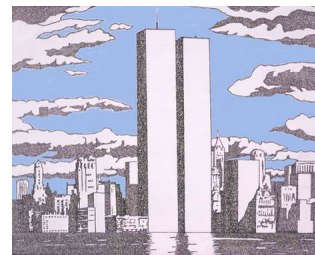
SBA has been working with the Deans & Parking Services to address the recent parking issues.

- Parking Services began moving some permit holders to another parking lot.
- The University Place parking spots in the S1 lot cannot be used as it is not under the control of the University. The UP developers own those parking spots.
- If you ever have problems finding a parking spot, you can see someone from Parking Services (at the guard hut by the visitor's lot or in the NCR building adjacent to the lot) and ask for a temporary permit to park in another lot. If you are refused, contact Parking Services to complain.
